II. Approval of Minutes: Approved.III. Approval of Agenda: Approved.

IV. Principal's Report: Greg Seiveright

- Community Carousel: not well attended (about 15 attendees); spent \$150 on refreshments and babysitting; presenters left with positive messages; engagement needs to be done for future events
- Math Night: very well attended (over 100 people); each child went home with a board game; really well run, smooth and successful
- BRAVE education was at the school today (April 2nd); 3 grade 1 and 3 grade 4; communication, preventing bullying, etc.
- Track and Field on the horizon; 2 separate days (grade 3-4; grade 5-8), in early May; district meet after
- EQAO on the horizon; usually end of May/early June; 4 sessions language and 4 sessions Math (grade 3 and 6)
- Outdoor Classroom and turf ideas: heard back from facilities services; turf project unlikely (\$500,000); need to complete a proposal for the outdoor classroom (submitted); there are a lot of hoops to jump through
- Outdoor Equipment Replenishment for spring (see details in voting)
- Spring Carnival: Napanee Police (going to bring a boat and vehicle) for Touch the Truck; waiting to hear back from Napanee Fire Fighters (usually on board), Nicole has a contact for the town to bring a dump truck

V. Teacher Representative's Report: Amy Kennedy-York (Jen Cole on her behalf)

- Grade 8 classes: Kitchen-Cooking, Lego-Robotics, Cover-letter Writing Class; experiential learning; using new kits with Lego-Robotics (currently 9 kits); 3-4 kids are using 1 kitmaking it work, but having 1 extra kit would be helpful (\$594+tax/kit)
- Student Support Counseller (Julie Burrows) requesting \$100 to purchase Arts and Crafts supplies for Pride Alliance Club; planning to make jewellry to sell.
- Grade 8's Book of Awesome requesting an update on how much SAC is contributing.
 - \$5/per grade 8 +\$100 per class
 - SAC covering the remainder for their help with events
- Mrs. Jones's got the RC cars; kids love them
